

2024 GRAND MARSHAL Painted Hills Natural Beef



In the mid-1990's a group of ranchers in Wheeler County, Oregon started meeting to talk about the challenging cattle markets they were trying to navigate. They were frustrated with the fact they were raising quality cattle but getting low prices for their hard work. Beef found in the grocery case was inconsistent and did not reflect the effort being put into their herds.

Meeting in living rooms around Wheeler County for about two years, seven of those ranching families decided to take action in 1997 and Painted Hills Natural Beef was formed. Original members were Merten and Glenda Homer, David Hunt, Bryce and Peg Logan, Pat and Joanne Keys, Dan and Kim Domenighini, Bill and Judy Potter, and Thom Mauritson. A few years later, Bill and Judy retired from the business

and Will and Gabrielle Homer took their place.

Our company quickly became known for its quality and consistency. Stores were pleased with the personal service of ranchers who walked in their door to help sell beef and visit with their customers. If there was a problem, typically it was one of the ranchers that picked up the phone or walked in the door to address the concern. Consumers purchasing in the store appreciated being able to speak directly to the ranchers and tasting the high-quality beef during store demos. Our first slogan "Beef Like Grandpa Used to Raise" came directly from these interactions.

Over the years we have been blessed with so many employees that it would be difficult to recognize them all. They each left their mark on the company to varying degrees, and we are so grateful for them all. Today the company is managed day to day by Will and Gabrielle, with employees (in order of hire date) Scott Mertens, Tracy Lewis, Micha Urbach, Melissa Carnine, Holly McDermott, Lisa Green, and Catherine Espinoza.

Through all of the successes and challenges, the company has remained committed to providing jobs in Wheeler County and supporting our surrounding communities in as many ways as possible. This includes caring for a 2-mile stretch of Hwy 19 doing regular highway clean-up. We also frequently donate product, materials and time to area food pantries, school activities, community fundraisers and non-profit organizations. We strive to represent our area well in all we do.

Painted Hills Natural Beef is honored to be chosen as the Grand Marshal for the 2024 Wheeler County Fair. Our participation is in loving memory of Joanne Keys; we will forever value the importance of her efforts to the company, the fair, and our communities.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

NO ATTENTION WILL BE GIVEN TO ANY ENTRY WITHOUT ENTRY CARD/EXHIBITOR NUMBER

PREMIUMS: Blue-\$5.00, Red-\$3.00, White-\$2.00

- 1. All awards for which cash prizes are offered will be paid in cash when entries are picked up. <u>NO</u> checks will be mailed. If arrangements for pick-up of cash prizes are not made, prizes will be forfeit.
- 2. Any protests or complaints against the decision of the judges regarding any article or animal being exhibited must be files with the secretary of the Fair Board before the close of the Fair on Sunday.
- 3. All exhibits will be released at 9:00 AM on Sunday of Fair Week.
- 4. NOR ARTICLE OR ANIMAL SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIR BEFORE THE OFFI-CIAL RELEASE TIME OF 9 AM ON SUNDAY, EXCEPT BY WRITTEN PERMISSION OF TWO FAIR BOARD MEMBERS. ANY UNAUTHORIZED REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS WILL CAUSE THE FORFEIT OF ALL PREMIUMS WON BY EXHIBITOR.
- 5. All exhibit halls will be closed and locked at 6:00 PM nightly.
- 6. The general supervision of the grounds and entire exhibition, regulations, etc. are vested in the Fair Board. Superintendents shall have charge of their respective departments.
- 7. No person shall be allowed to sell or give away entered articles on the fairgrounds during the fair without the permission of the Fair Board.
- 8. OREGON FAIRS ASSOCIATION cards WILL NOT be honored for entry to the rodeo.
- 9. **PRE-REGISTRATION IS ENCOURAGED.** Exhibitors may obtain entry sheets and tags at the post offices in Fossil, Mitchell, and Spray as well as the Fair Office. Exhibitors must bring their entry sheets and tags to the fair office **<u>BEFORE</u>** entering exhibits in the proper exhibit areas.
- 10. Parade entries must be made at the fair office by Friday of Fair Week, by 7 PM. Late or unregistered entries may be included in the parade at the superintendent's discretion, but premiums **WILL NOT** be awarded.
- 11. Each exhibitor must have an exhibitor number, and they must include that number on all entry tags. You can get your exhibitor number from the fair secretary—By phone: (541) 763-4560. By email: wheelercountyfair@co.wheeler.or.us. By Facebook Messenger: Wheeler County Fairgrounds-Fossil, Oregon. In person: Fair Office in Fossil.
- 12. An entry tag must accompany all animals and articles and remain attached for the duration of the fair. No exhibitor may attach or display any ribbons or awards to their exhibit other than what is awarded—doing so will forfeit all premiums wone by exhibitor.
- 13. Colors denoting awards will be as follows: 1st-Blue-\$5.00; 2nd-Red-\$3.00; 3rd-White, \$2.00.
- 14. Observing the judges during the judging of exhibits is allowed, but there is to be absolutely no interference. Any exhibitor found to have done so will forfeit all premiums won.
- 15. In all cases the Fair Board reserves the right to accept, reject, or accept with conditions any entry.



OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK-RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. All GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS apply to the open class livestock divisions.
- 2. All livestock tags must be attached to the pens of the exhibitor's livestock. Livestock will be accepted on Wednesday of Fair Week.
- 3. Please see the Livestock Superintendent for stall or pen assignments. Provide the Livestock Superintendent with the age of the animal.
- 4. All livestock must be on exhibit by 7:00 PM Wednesday of fair week.
- 5. Animals not manageable at the time of the fair will not be accepted as entries and must be removed from the fairgrounds. The decision shall be at the discretion of the Fair Board and shall be final.
- 6. No animal or bird that shows evidence of any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to remain on the grounds. Cattle exhibited must be Brucellosis free. Animals exhibited from livestock herds tested not clean must have clearance from the Oregon State Department of Agriculture.
- 7. Bedding will be arranged for by exhibitor
- 8. All pens must be cleaned by 8 AM daily. Exhibitor must haul animal waste to the designated dumping location.
- 9. The Fair Board will not pay any transportation costs.
- 10. The judges will in no case award a premium where there is not merit. When one animal is exhibited in a section or class, only one premium will be awarded.
- 11. Judges of all livestock will have regard to symmetry, early maturity, size, general qualities and characteristics of any breed they inspect. They will make due allowances for the effect of feeding and other circumstances on the character and condition of the animal.
- 12. Exhibitors must have the entry card in a conspicuous place on the animal during the judging. NOTE: On penned animals, please place cards, ribbons, etc., out of reach of the animals.
- 13. No attention will be given by judges to any animal or participant without its card or number.
- 14. OWNER OR ATTENDANT MUST BE PRESENT DURING JUDGING OF LIVESTOCK ENTRIES EXCEPT PENNED ANIMALS.
- 15. If it is determined that an animal has been entered in a division or class in which it does not belong, it is the duty of the Superintendent to investigate, and if by mistake, to correct it; otherwise no premium will be paid.
- 16. All entries of purebred cattle shall contain name and number as shown on the Certificate of Registration. Registration papers must correspond with the animals and will be checked by the Livestock Superintendent. Exhibitors must provide papers upon request.
- 17. All grade animals of the same breed shall follow the sire. No registered livestock may be entered in grade classes.
- 18. All exhibits must be in the name of the bona-fide owner.
- 19. Animal age is determined by the date of the fair.
- 20. No animal will be permitted to enter the arena unless under halter and in the care of an attendant. Cattle exhibited in pens are excepted from this rule. Registered livestock may be shown on halter.
- 21. No premium shall be allowed to animals which are spavined, ring boned, blind or otherwise defective.
- 22. Livestock stalls must be cleaned with waste hauled to the designated area by exhibitor by 2:00 PM Sunday of Fair Week, or exhibitor will be charged a fee.
- 23. All livestock must be kept on the Fairgrounds until 9:00 AM Sunday of Fair Week. Exception to this rule are horses that are not boarded on the grounds and animals removed with written permission of the Fair Board. Forfeiture of all premiums will result if animals are removed early.
- 24. Sportsman-like conduct is expected at all times, and the Superintendent shall be in charge.



OPEN CLASS GENERAL RULES

THESE RULES APPLY TO EXHIBITORS IN THE OPEN CLASS DIVISION, <u>OTHER THAN LIVESTOCK</u>.

PRE-REGISTRATION IS ENCOURAGED (See General Rules and Regulations)

** NO entry fees will be charged.**

- 1. All articles must be entered between the hours of 1 PM and 7 PM, Wednesday, Fair Week. NOTE LIVESTOCK ENTRY DEADLINE UNDER LIVESTOCK section.
- 2. All entries must be entered, tagged and in place in their building by 7PM on Wednesday of fair week.
- 3. Standard containers will be furnished for cut flowers.
- 4. All references to ages will be effective as of the date all exhibits are accepted on the fair grounds.
- 5. Read the General Rules in the front of the Fair Book and also the rules for classes you are planning to enter.
- 6. Fair Management is not responsible for errors in entries, BUT Superintendents can make necessary corrections if articles are found to be incorrectly entered.
- 7. The Fair Board will use every precaution in its power for the safe preservation of all articles on exhibit, but will not be responsible for loss or damage.
- 8. No article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium, BUT no premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition.
- 9. Any error in the recording of premiums awarded caused by oversight shall be subject to correction.
- 10. In case of a point tie in Special Awards, the winner will be determined by the exhibitor having the most BLUE Ribbons.
- 11. Items MUST be entered in their own categories, if one is listed, rather than in Other or Miscellaneous. If in "Other" or "Miscellaneous", put the names on entry tags and blanks.
- 12. "Special" and "Best of Show" awards which are Sponsored by individuals, merchants, organizations are a valuable added incentive to our premium awards. (Those who participate would appreciate hearing from winners of the awards they donate, acknowledging their contributions).
- 13. Entries will be released Sunday at 9 AM.
- 14. No article or animal shall be removed from the Fair before the official time except by special WRITTEN permission of two Fair Board members.
- 15. All awards for which cash prizes are offered will be paid in cash at the Fair Office when entries are picked up between 9:00AM and 12:00PM Sunday.

All threshed grains to be exhibited in glass gallon jars. Crops must be grown in the present year and by the exhibitor. State strain type on entry tag. An exhibitor may enter no more than 2 entries in each lot.

SHEAVES OF GRAIN & GRASSES MUST BE CROP OF THE PRESENT YEAR, GROWN BY EXHIBITOR.

Hints:

All sheaves are judged for quality and attractiveness. They should be 12" in length from bottom of head to base of the sheaf, with the base even and 2" across at the butt, (exception on bromes and fescues which can be 1" across butt) where they will be measured. Tie tightly with string 3 times. Label 'Other Kinds' by name on the entry tags. Sheaves must fulfill these requirements.

DIVISION J AGRICULTURE Open Class

Superintendent - Terri Hunt

Open to Wheeler County Residents ONLY

All exhibits must be entered, tagged and in place, in their buildings by 7 PM, Wednesday of Fair Week. Agriculture exhibits must have been grown in Wheeler County, and they MUST be viable.

HINT: To prepare an attractive display, consider the following when you select and prepare vegetables for fair:

- *Trueness to type*-specimens should be typical of the variety in shape, color, and size.
- *Quality and condition*-specimens should be edible, in prime condition, and free from blemishes or damage from insects, disease, or handling. Specimens with deepest color are preferred.
- Uniformity-specimens should be alike in size, shape, color, texture, and stage of maturity.
- *Size*-contrary to popular opinion, large entries do not have a competitive edge over other entries (except for special entries such as largest pumpkin, watermelon, or head of cabbage). Medium-sized specimens are more typical of a variety and most desired.
- *Cleanliness*-dirt detracts from the natural attractiveness of vegetables and conveys an unfavorable impression to the judges and the public. Wipe cucumbers, tomatoes, pepper, and other soft skinned vegetables with a damp cloth. Wash or lightly brush soil from potatoes, carrots, and beets. Clean leafy vegetables such as Swiss chard by dipping in cool water.



1/2 cups sugar
3 eggs
2 1/4 cups flour
1 teaspoon allspice
1 teaspoon cinnamon


Ingredients:

3 ¹⁄₂ cups all-purpose flour 3⁄₄ teaspoon salt 3⁄₄ teaspoon soda 1 ¹⁄₂ cups buttermilk

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 450°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and set aside. In a large mixing bowl add the flour, salt, and baking soda. Whisk to combine thoroughly.
- Using a wooden spoon, make a well in the center of the dry ingredients. Add the buttermilk to the dry ingredients in the well. Use the wooden spoon to gently stire the ingredients together, starting at the cent of the bowl and slowly working outward. The dough will be very shaggy, that's perfect.
- Lightly flour the work surface, then pour the dough out onto the surface. Use your hands to gently knead the dough about four (4) times, until it comes off your hands to shape into a round loaf.
- Transfer the loaf to the prepared baking sheet. Lightly sprinkle the top with flour. Use a sharp knife to slash an X on the top of the dough.
- Transfer right away to the over and bake for 15 minutes. Lower temperature to 400°F, rotate the pan 180 degrees in the oven, and bake for an additional 25-30 minutes, until deeply golden brown. Allow to cool at least 20 minutes.

EMERGENCY PLAN



Purpose:

To provide safety for the citizens attending the Wheeler County Fair & Rodeo, in the event of a natural or human-caused disaster.

Law Enforcement/Search & Rescue:

The Wheeler County Sheriff's Office (WCSO) performs these responsibilities. WCSO will be Night Watch: responsible for all law enforcement/emergency • operations, incl. (but not limited to) traffic, enforcement of laws and search & rescue.

Medical:

First aid on the fairgrounds is provided by a team of Emergency Medical Technicians through Fossil Ambulance and by Asher Community Health Center, adjacent to the fairgrounds.

Fire Fighting Services:

- Fossil Volunteer Fire Department performs this responsibility. Inspections have been made of all buildings on the fairgrounds for hazards.
- Exits are clearly visible for speedy evacuation of the public in the event of a fire or other disaster

Power Failure:

Due to the low number of night functions,

power failure is a minimal but still important concern.

In the event of power failure, the public will be advised to keep calm. Fair Board members and staff will assist the public with safe evacuation, calling for additional help if needed.

A night watchperson will be on duty during overnight hours.

Fair Board:

- Responsible for coordinating all task assignments.
- Cooperation with all agencies and personnel having task assignments.
- Coordinate and assist with communications. •
- Include Emergency Plan in fair book.
- Post Emergency Plan in visible locations.
